# **Unseen Realities III: More Than a Baby**

Ask 10 people the meaning of Christmas and you may get 10 different answers. It is a time for togetherness and generosity, a time for children, a time of redemption from our Scrooge-like ways, or a time for falling in love. Someone always admonishes us to "put Christ back in Christmas." Even this falls short.



At Christmas we should recall the story of the miraculous conception and birth of Jesus, but we cannot leave it there. The coming of Jesus into the world is not

an end in itself. God had a reason for invading this dark world, and we do well to dwell on this in December.

Last month we saw that *God was willing to sacrifice greatly to restore our broken relationship with him. Jesus came in to the world to BE that sacrifice.*Think of all that means!

This was no ordinary child. Jesus had a human mother, but his father is God! As a member of the Trinity, Jesus existed eternally before his birth as a human baby. John 1:1-8 describes him as 'the Word' which in the beginning was with God and was God himself. When he was born, "the Word became

flesh" (John 1:14). This is critical! In order for Jesus' sacrifice to cover the sins of humans, Jesus had to be a sinless human. In order for his sacrifice to cover the *entire* human race, he had to be God. The baby nursing at Mary's breast, was both God and man in one tiny bundle. Think of it!

Because of Jesus' nature and purpose on earth, ugly spiritual conflict surrounded his birth on that quiet Bethlehem night. Unseen all around that tranquil manger scene, a desperate attempt by Satan to thwart God's plan was already

As I write, I am in the back of a class room in a town called Mahendranagar somewhere in western Nepal. My partner, Dr. John Punalur, is teaching a class on pastoral care. This week my course is "Studying the Bible with a Sermon in Mind." We



have 24 students evenly divided between men and women. Things are going very well. Next week I will be teaching my theology course "Foundations of the Christian Faith II" in Hetauda, a city in Southern Nepal. I will be on my own next week without a partner. This is ok since any discussion of theology expands to fill all the available time. I plan to return home on December 16, by God's grace. Along with Dr. Punalur, I have done a pro-life demonstration with fetal models here and will do so again in Hetauda. I am thrilled with the response all our teaching has been receiving here from leaders hungry for ministry tools. That said, I am also looking forward to a brief respite over the holidays before heading back out to the Philippines January. To God be the glory.

underway. It would be an epic battle. Simeon, an old servant of God, was allowed to lay eyes on the Lord's Savior before his own death. He held the baby in his arms and prophesied about Jesus' life, declaring that Jesus "is destined to cause the rising and falling of many in Israel." Speaking directly to Mary, he added, "and a sword will pierce your soul also" (Luke 2:34-35). Simeon's allusion to the spiritual divide created by Jesus'

preaching and the death he would die was disquieting to Mary and Joseph to say the least. Simeon's words reflected the warfare already underway. Even as he spoke, the fury of hell was being unleashed against God's Son in the spiritual realm. Revelation 12 describes this warfare in vivid imagery. Satan is painted as great red dragon waiting for the blessed woman to give birth. He plans to savagely devour

the child. Michael and the angels are described as making war against the dragon and his demons to prevent this. The battle spilled into the physical realm as Herod sought the child to destroy him. Warned by an angel, Joseph and Mary fled in the night, living in Egypt for a time. The dragon was not strong enough to prevail! This same warfare surrounded Jesus' ministry right up to his arrest and crucifixion. He was tempted by Satan in the wilderness (Matthew 4:1-11), and continued to be tempted right up to the night he was arrested. Satan's main battle plan was to destroy God's Messiah. It was Satan himself who inspired Judas to betray Jesus (John 13:27). Satan's backup plan seemed to involve tempting Jesus to disobey God the Father. Jesus' prayer that God would "take this cup

away" (Luke 22:42) involved a strong temptation to avoid the cross entirely! In the end he walked the last mile of that torturous road for us all. This was the great climactic moment in that massive spiritual battle!

Doubtless, Satan believed he had won when Jesus breathed his last. But when Jesus rose triumphantly from his grave, the devilish celebration ground to a halt. Satan had lost

both the battle and the war! Salvation became possible. The final doom of the Devil became a guarantee. The innocent and helpless child in Mary's arms became the champion of righteousness, the destroyer of evil, the redeemer of mankind, and our personal savior! The baby in the manger became the Savior on the cross! The fellowship God desires with the human

race is now ours to enjoy. It includes fellowship with our brothers and sisters in Christ both near and far (I John 1:3). At the center of this unique human fellowship is the divine fellowship with God and his Son, a fellowship facilitated by the Holy Spirit who indwells every believer everywhere. The fellowship we enjoy with God and his people is a mere taste of life in the coming age—a spoonful of the ocean of God's grace to be revealed in ages to come! Heaven will surprise and thrill us forever! For now "we see in a glass darkly, but then face to face" (I Cor 13:12)! THIS is what God has accomplished. THIS was his aim. THIS is why Jesus was born. THIS unseen reality is what Christmas is REALLY all about! Jesus IS much more than a baby.
