In His Grip

Where in the World Were the Edmondsons Last Month?

The Edmondsons spent most of October in Rwanda. Two weeks were planned, one unplanned. In

Bihembe we led a new group of 29 pastor trainees in the first of six pastoral skills 'Caring classes, for God's People, which deals with visiting, listening to, advising, and helping other believers. This new group really celebrates God! I've never seen more worship! lively



We also spent week #2 in Bihembe with a different group of 'veteran' students. The subject was 'Harm to Harmony, Honoring One Another in the Family.' We received incredible reports of results from the students' action plans made

during their last class on 'Christian Stewardship.' One man reported that, within two weeks of his re-teaching the course in his church, the church's mortgage (about 400,000 Francs) was paid in full. At the same time the church began to directly support older widows in the church. This testimony eventually resulted in 31 souls coming to Christ. Another leader reported that, following his re-teaching the Christian Stewardship course, 10 families in his church began

to tithe and the church's monthly income doubled. There are many more stories. The reports took 3 hours.

Loving Those You Can't Understand



There is a constant in human nature. People find it hard to love those who are different. Whether a different tribe, a different race, a different nationality, or a different age, people are uncomfortable with those whose thinking, background, circumstances, or appearance are different than their own. We tend to prefer people pretty much just like us. Christians seem to do this as much as non-Christians—maybe more, since we can add theological traditions and worship styles to the list of litmus tests. This love of the familiar creates a functional

exclusiveness among Christians which is very strange given that God has commissioned us to 'go into all the world and preach the gospel' (Mark 16:15). This command actually *requires* us to interact and care for people very different from us.

God never gives us a command that we can't carry out. He has provided us tutoring on how to love someone we don't fully

understand: Marriage. That's right. I'm talking about learning to deal with, accept, and show love for the opposite sex in spite of profound differences in the way we think and act. Those of you who are married know exactly what I mean. Even if you are single, you still have to deal with the opposite sex in various contexts. You also have the difficult challenge of understanding married people.

In more than four decades of married life I have pondered the differences between men and women. I recently came across an old list I made of potential subjects for a series of humorous articles on men and women communicating:

- What men are really saying: A guide for the uninitiated.
- What women are really saying: A guide for the confused.
- "I just want to watch the game.": A guide to masculine (non) communication.
- "There must be a pony here somewhere." A guide to feminine (over) communication.
- "Are you coming to the point any time soon?" and other stupid things men say to women.

came to faith in Christ.

- 805 people received training in Christian stewardship in general or in some area of it.
- Many churches had big increases in their giving.
- Several 'Savings Groups' were launched with the aim of pooling resources to provide loans and financial aid to people in need.
- Several businesses were launched selling everything from vegetables to bricks.

Following this class we planned for Eileen to return to the states while I moved on to Cameroon to teach at the Hope Bible Institute there.

God had other plans. A disputed presidential election in Cameroon produced civil unrest making travel there unsafe. Riots occurred. People were shot. Gatherings were banned. It was impossible to try and conduct our class in these conditions, so I spent a third week in Rwanda. I made some great progress on an important writing project. In November we plan by God's grace is to spend two weeks in Nepal teaching Theology and Christian Theist World View. It is a turbulent world. Thank you for your prayers. They make all the difference! 奏

Loving Those You Can't Understand (cont'd)

"The history of my life... and my hair appointment." How women tell stories.

These kinds of differences have increasingly

produced laughter in our marriage rather than irritation. We are learning to marvel at how differently we are wired and have (mostly) given up on the fruitless exercise of whining because we don't feel perfectly understood. Full knowledge is not a requirement for full love-and that is a delightful discovery.

Such discoveries can teach us larger spiritual lessons. We are called upon to love God deeply. Do you fully comprehend God? Of course not! Yet you can know Him and love Him with all your heart and soul and mind and strength (Deut 6:5). God also commands us to

love other Christians deeply (I Peter 4:8). Do you understand everyone around you at church? No way. Yet you don't have to fully understand them or be like them to love them deeply just as God commands. Finally, God wants us to love the lost (Luke 6:27-28, and many others). This means people of all colors, creeds, languages, and backgrounds. It includes the very wealthy and the very

poor. It refers to the young and the old, to male and female. It encompasses the wise and the foolish, the prisoner, the sick and

> disabled, the politician, the Muslim. the Hindu. Animist, the Post-modernist. the Republican and the Democrat... It is a command to love and seek the lost WHOEVER AND WHEREVER THEY ARE.

> God has given you all that you need to love uncomfortable people. Comfort, like full knowledge, is not prerequisite for loving deeply. Just begin. I dare you. Take some simple steps. Have a conversation with someone you would ordinarily bypass.

Go out of your way with an act of kindness for someone you might normally ignore. Strike up a conversation with that neighbor you have yet to meet. Offer to pray for someone who needs it. Then actually pray. You've got this. I think you will find that your life is enriched in surprising ways by people you can't even understand.
